MINUTES OF MEETING WESTWOOD OF PASCO COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT

FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS

Call to Order/Roll Call

Ms. Cerbone called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m. Supervisors Zook, Snyder and Pianco were present. Supervisors Mize and Janek were not present.

SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS

Public Comments

There were no members of the public present.

THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Public Hearing to Consider the Adoption of an Assessment Roll and the Imposition of Special Assessments Relating to the Financing and Securing of Certain Public Improvements

On MOTION by Mr. Zook and seconded by Mr. Snyder, with all in favor, the Public Hearing was opened.

- A. Affidavit/Proof of Publication
- B. Mailed Notice to Property Owner(s)

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Ms. Cerbone presented the affidavit of publication and mailed notice of the public hearing evidencing the publication and notice, as required, were included for informational

purposes.

C. Engineer's Report and Capital Improvement Program (for informational purposes)

Ms. Cerbone stated that all references to a "daycare" need to be removed from the

Engineer's Report because, based on zoning, a daycare likely cannot be within the CDD.

Ms. Mackie stated that approval of the Engineer's Report, as part of Resolution 2023-34,

will be approved, with the understanding that references to a "daycare" will be removed and the

updated version will be attached to the Resolution.

Ms. Mackie acknowledged the change just stated and noted that there were no other

substantive changes to the Engineer's Report since it was last presented and approved.

The following questions were posed and answered:

Ms. Mackie: In your professional opinion are the estimated costs of the project to be

funded by District reasonable and proper?

Mr. Couch: Yes.

Ms. Mackie: Is there any reason that the project cannot be carried out by the District?

Mr. Couch: No.

D. Master Special Assessment Methodology Report (for informational purposes)

Ms. Cerbone stated that the Master Special Assessment Methodology Report was

presented and approved at the last meeting. She noted the following change will be made:

Section 2.2: Change "Forestar (USA) Real Estate Group Inc." to "D.R. Horton"

The following questions were posed and answered;

Ms. Mackie: Do the lands subject to assessment receive a special benefit from the

District's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP)?

Ms. Cerbone: Yes, they do.

Ms. Mackie: Are those special assessments reasonably apportioned among the lands

subject to the special assessment?

Ms. Cerbone: Yes, they are.

Ms. Mackie: Is it reasonable, proper and just to assess the cost of the CIP against the

lands in the District in accordance with the Methodology as documented in the assessment roll

attached?

Ms. Cerbone: Yes, it is.

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Ms. Mackie: And the special benefits that the lands receive, as set forth in the roll, are those equal to or in excess of the maximum special assessments indicated thereon?

Ms. Cerbone: Yes, they are.

- E. Consideration of Resolution 2023-34, Authorizing District Projects for Construction and/or Acquisition of Infrastructure Improvements; Equalizing, Approving, Confirming, and Levying Special Assessments on Property Specially Benefited by Such Projects to Pay the Cost Thereof; Providing for the Payment and the Collection of Such Special Assessments by the Methods Provided for by Chapters 170, 190 And 197, Florida Statutes; Confirming the District's Intention to Issue Special Assessment Revenue Bonds; Making Provisions for Transfers of Real Property to Governmental Bodies, Providing for the Recording of an Assessment Notice; Providing for Severability, Conflicts and an Effective Date
 - Hear testimony from the affected property owners as to the propriety and advisability of making the improvements and funding them with special assessments on the property.

Public comment was requested. No members of the public or affected property owners spoke.

 Thereafter, the governing authority shall meet as an equalizing board to hear any and all complaints as to the special assessments on a basis of justice and right.

The Board, sitting as the Equalizing Board, made no changes to the assessments.

The Board resumed as the CDD Board.

On MOTION by Mr. Zook and seconded by Mr. Snyder, with all in favor, the Public Hearing was closed.

- Ms. Cerbone presented Resolution 2023-34 and read the title.
- Ms. Mackie stated that this Resolution accomplishes the following:
- Makes certain findings based on the steps the CDD has taken to date and the evidence presented today.
- Approves the CDD's projects in both the Engineer's Report and Master Special Assessment Methodology Report by virtue of the attachment of the two Reports, as corrected to reflect the changed made today.

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Equalizes and approves and confirms the special assessments and allocates them in accordance with the Methodology.

Provides for the payment and prepayment of the special assessments and the method of collection.

Provides for the application of true-up payments.

Provides that certain properties may be exempt from assessments, to the extent that the properties are sold to those types of owners.

Directs Staff to record a Notice of Special Assessments documenting the CDD's levy of the assessments.

Ms. Mackie stated that, while master assessments are being levied, this will not result in the requirement for any landowner to pay special assessments until bonds are issued.

On MOTION by Mr. Zook and seconded by Mr. Snyder, with all in favor, Resolution 2023-34, Authorizing District Projects for Construction and/or Acquisition of Infrastructure Improvements; Equalizing, Approving, Confirming, and Levying Special Assessments on Property Specially Benefited by Such Projects to Pay the Cost Thereof; Providing for the Payment and the Collection of Such Special Assessments by the Methods Provided for by Chapters 170, 190 And 197, Florida Statutes; Confirming the District's Intention to Issue Special Assessment Revenue Bonds; Making Provisions for Transfers of Real Property to Governmental Bodies, Providing for the Recording of an Assessment Notice; Providing for Severability, Conflicts and an Effective Date, was adopted.
